Activity options explained

Please note that most of our planned activities are weather dependent. In the case of bad weather, which does not allow for the following outdoor activities to take place, we ask for your patience, cooperation, and understanding. We will have indoor elective activities offered as alternatives in the event that it storms during the weekend. There are no refunds offered for weather related alterations or cancellations in the planned activity schedule.

Pool (all ages)

Free swim offered. Parents must accompany small children. Children who are able to pass the Ranch Camp swim test may swim with a lifeguard on duty, without parental supervision.

Archery (age 7 and above)

We use bows that are suitable for camper-aged children and adults!

Three horseback riding opportunities for children of all ages:

- Adult trail ride: Older children and adults have an opportunity to take a trail ride on our 400-acre property. Rides are operated and led by our corral staff.
- Children's Rodeo (children under 10)
 - On Shabbat morning, we hold our annual Family Camp Children's Rodeo. This is an opportunity for younger children to experience horses in a structured, fun setting. We will have games, pony rides, and independent riding for older children in our riding arena.
- Horseback Arena Lesson (ages 7-10)
 Children will have the opportunity to do a formal arena lesson, working on walking and basic riding skills in the corral.

High Ropes course – Zip Line (age 7 and above) Some activities might include the zip line only or the cat walk to the zip line, where the person must climb up a tall pole and walk across a log high above the ground to get to the zipline. All participants will have the option to skip the catwalk.

Low Ropes (all ages) Working with balance and creative problem solving on rope features on the ground

Climbing Wall (age 7 and above) If your child is younger than 7 but can fit in one of the Ranch Camp climbing harnesses, they will get a chance to do this. Generally, the harnesses are made for kids 7 and up. Adults can do this as well.

Sports (all ages)

Play basketball, soccer, and frisbee equipment on basketball court and fields Activity: open all activity sessions and early morning Saturday

Tie-dye (all ages)

Bring something with you to tie-dye: a t-shirt, pajamas, bandana from home to tie-dye. A limited amount of Ranch Camp t-shirts will be available at camp this year.

Arts and crafts (all ages) Located in the Moadon. This room will be open to families most of the weekend and be led by camp staff.

Teva (all ages) Experience the goats, and chickens and learn about the plants and garden at the JCC Ranch Camp
