

Tiyulim (Trips) Town Hall FAQs

What trip will my camper be eligible for in Summer 2021?

We want campers to participate in the program they would like next year, whether that is TASC or Teen Village. Campers can make individual decisions or can communicate with their 2020 cohort and make a decision collectively.

We will send out the 2020 Tiyulim Directory so families can communicate with one another.

What are the Summer 2021 dates & when will registration open?

We are aiming to open registration after the High Holy Days in October.

We are working on finalizing our Summer 2021 dates. Based on the results of the dates survey that went out at the end of August we are anticipating keeping our summer schedule consistent with the past few seasons. Dates are subject to change.

Session 1 (14 day session) - Starting towards the beginning of June

Session 2 (19 day session) - Starting mid-June

Session 3 (19 day session) - Starting mid-July

Teen Village – Starting mid-Session 2, finishing at end of Session 3

If we rolled over our registration from last summer, when will we register?

If you rolled over your 2020 registration to 2021, we will be in contact with your family before registration opens to confirm what session and program your camper(s) would like to participate in. Our registrar will work with you to secure those spots before registration opens to the public.

Will grades be mixed on the trips in Summer 2021?

Yes, there is a possibility that grades will be mixed for both TASC and Teen Village. The more campers that sign up for a particular program with their 2020 cohort, the more likely they will be with campers in their own grade. We will adjust the programmatic/social pieces of the trip to meet the needs of the campers attending should there be mixed grades.

Will campers from out of state be able to participate in Summer 2021?

We will follow the guidance of local, state, and federal government. Currently, we are operating under the assumption that camp will be open to all of our campers, regardless of where they live. We know that many things will change between now and the start of Summer 2021. As these things shift and change we commit to communicating in a timely and transparent manner.

If my campers end up on the same trip, will they be in the same or different groups?

We will do our best to honor any and all bunk/group request as always! There are a lot of factors that go into creating trip groups and we will take all of those factors into consideration alongside all bunk requests.

In so many words, yes there is a chance your campers will be in the same group if they are in the same program.



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What will COVID-19 precautions look like?

We will follow the guidance of local, state, and federal government, opting to adhere to the strictest guidelines to ensure that we are keeping our campers and staff safe. As we get closer to Summer 2021, we will be sure to communicate what the updated health & safety policies will be (i.e. mask wearing, sanitizing measures, etc.)

Group size on trips is already limited to 12 campers per group (due to vehicle and trail capacities). We won't go above 12 campers & 3 staff per group and if it needs to be adjusted to a lower number we will address that.

We know COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines are constantly changing. What happens as these changes impact Summer 2021?

We anticipate as COVID-19 restrictions and guidelines change on the local, state, and federal level. We know that these changes will inevitably impact our Summer 2021 plans. We commit to communicating with you in a timely and transparent manner about all aspects of Summer 2021 including, but not limited to, dates, rates, finances, program structure, etc.

What are Colorado's current COVID-19 restrictions?

We encourage all families to stay up-to-date on all COVID-19 restrictions. Many of our families are out of state. The best way to stay up-to-date on Colorado's restrictions is the Colorado COVID-19 webpage: https://covid19.colorado.gov/.
